Saturday- Sample the richness of Pacific Northwest in **Farmers' market in Beaverton**, named after beaver dams throughout in earlier 19 century, but now Silicon Forest of metropolitan Portland.

Visit **End of the Oregon Trail** in historic Oregon City where settlers filed land claims after 2,000 miles of treacherous journey from western Missouri, Continental Divide, to fertile Willamette Valley.



Winding along the **Mt Hood Scenic Byway**, ponder the uncertain time in present and past while mesmerized by the majestic Mt Hood and picturesque reflection in **Trillium Lake**.

Savor the Oregon bounty in **Timberline Lodge**, a public building project that provided jobs and hopes to countless unemployed during Great Depression.



In Ring of Fire surrounding Pacific basin, volcanic Mt. Hood forest are rich in meandering streams and dams built by beavers, keystone species creating wetland and wholesome **habitat for wildlife**, migratory fish, birds.

Sunday- Atop Crown Point, the grandeur of **Columbia River Gorge**, 4000 ft deep carved over millennia and still evolving, is breathtaking. As mist dances off **Multnomah falls** tumbling 600 feet down basalt cliff, it lifts our spirits high.



The fertile Mt Hood volcanic and glacial runoff gives rise to the bountiful **Hood River Valley Fruit Loop**. And world-class kiteboarding at **Hood River**, in the nature wind tunnel, is a delight to see.



On board **Sternwheeler Cruise**, Columbia River Gorge is simply awe-inspiring; while **Bonneville Locks & Dam** and **Fish Ladder** showcase human ingenuity in mighty River hydroelectricity and stewardship in wildlife.

Columbia Gorge Interpretive Center Museum, a building with its walls mimicking basalt cliff seen throughout the Gorge, is on the Lewis & Clark Trail and covers 15 thousand years of history.
